TEMPORARY FIXES NOW, PERMANENT SOLUTIONS IN THE FUTURE FOR DOGS LIKE ROCKY, staying cool affects more than just comfort, it impacts their abil-

FOR DOGS LIKE ROCKY, staying cool affects more than just comfort, it impacts their ability to breathe. That's because some dogs do not tolerate the heat well due to the shape of their skull and snout or their advanced age.

Many of the dogs who come to our shelter are also heartworm positive. At SPCA Tampa Bay, we give an infected dog an initial heartworm treatment and provide adopters with follow-up antibiotics. We provide pain medication and limit a dog's activity, so they only take short, slow walks while they are undergoing treatment. In Florida, they also benefit from a climate-controlled space to rest while their body heals.

Our facility limits the appropriate housing we can provide for these dogs based on availability of just a handful of climate-controlled kennels we have currently.

With the Florida summer months upon us and the aging state of our canine kennels, we've been forced to put some temporary solutions in place as we work toward our vision for a BETTER WAY HOME. Our Facilities team has moved a portable air conditioning unit into one of our dog housing areas as a test. The difference it makes is subtle and it comes at a sacrifice – the unit takes up a whole kennel, which means one dog fewer can be housed in that area.





In addition to the limited number of air-conditioned kennels, we have also been forced to temporarily shut down other kennels while we make repairs. Failing cement block walls

reveal their rebar insides, so our facilities team has lined about two dozen kennels with FRP (fiberglass reinforced panels) to cover failing block walls and added steel endcaps. It's an ongoing project as we fight the extreme age of our facility.

But these are not permanent solutions – they're stopgap measures to retrofit an aging facility that desperately needs to be replaced. The majority of our current canine kennels are split – half of each kennel is indoors and half is outdoors, exposed to the extreme summer temperatures we'll see for the next few months. All we can do in those spaces is keep the air moving, but that's counter-productive when dealing with airborne viruses like kennel cough.

For now, we'll continue to keep dogs like Rocky as comfortable as we can. **Our new shelter will allow us to control the temperature in all of our canine kennels and dramatically cut down on the spread of airborne illness with high-quality air purification systems.**
